RECORD ENROLLMENT

The Undergraduate Admissions team, in collaboration with campus partners, enrolled the **largest, most diverse, and academically excellent incoming class in university history**. This year's new student class is 7% larger than last year and 18% larger than 2019. 47% of incoming students self-identify with ethnicities other than white, with a **13.5% increase in enrollment of male students of color**, a reverse of the declining national trend. Through innovative and strategic recruitment practices, the team met students and their families virtually and in-person. The **campus tour broke records with over 27,257 guests** and the team held over 2,300 individual meetings with prospective students and families. The team made over **92,375 phone calls**, answered more than **30,000 incoming calls**, sent over **850,000 text messages**, and delivered about **70 million emails**. The team hosted **Admitted Student Day** and implemented **Destination Arizona**, a new extended Orientation opportunity. Through these efforts and commitment, the Admissions team were able to ensure broad access to the university and yield the most diverse and academically excellent class the university has ever seen.

FINANCIAL AID & AFFORDABILITY

For Fall 2022, the **Office of Scholarships & Financial Aid (OSFA)** has disbursed over **\$321M in aid to almost 34,000 students**. This includes federal and institutional grants, merit- and need-based scholarships, and student and parent loans. OSFA continues to expand events and outreach to help students and supporters make informed decisions about paying for college and investing in their future.

New for 2022-23, the **Arizona Native Scholars**

Grant covers the difference between tuition and mandatory fees and all other gift aid received for Native, Arizona resident, full-time undergraduate students seeking their first bachelor's degree. Starting in Spring 2022, the **Arizona Promise Grant** covers the same costs for eligible Arizona residents with an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of zero. Together with the **Pell Pledge Grant**, these programs are opening doors of opportunity to help even more Wildcats enroll and graduate.

STUDENT SUCCESS & RETENTION

Helping students stay enrolled and working towards their degree is a collective effort. This past year, Student Success & Retention Innovation (SSRI) has witnessed the impact of campus-wide collaborations and partnerships; the university achieved an **First-Time Full-Time retention rate of 85.6%, making it the university's highest rate ever.** The continued efforts of SSRI and campus partners aim to reach even higher levels this coming year and support the success of the university's new 2022 first-year students.

The **Student Success District (SSD) opened this year**, where holistic student support is available throughout the Bartlett Academic Success Center and the newly renovated Bear Down Building. The SSD has created welcoming spaces that focus on success resources for all students. This past year **SSRI departments directly supported students through over 144,000 visits:** workshops, tutoring sessions, community-building events, peer-mentoring meetings, advising and coaching appointments, and other student support programming.

ARIZONA INTERNATIONAL

At census Fall 2022, total international enrollments across all modalities and locations grew to a **record 6,242 students**, a 25% increase over the previous year's international student enrollment record of 5,005. As pandemic restrictions receded, Arizona International renewed focus on the development of the Global Microcampus Network and established more resources worldwide to engage with future online and main campus students. The increased demand for UArizona programs is demonstrated by **Fall 2022 application growth of 28%** over the prior period. Total **new to main campus international enrollment reached 915 for Fall 2022**, a 30% increase from Fall 2021. **New to main undergraduate and graduate enrollments grew 55% and 11%**, respectively. The **total international enrollments worldwide in Fall 2022 of 6,242** included main campus enrollment growth of 11%, reaching 3,492 and combined growth across Microcampus and online enrollments of 26%, reaching 2,339*. A **student cohort of more than 122 nationalities** also set a new record for most diverse enrollment period.

ARIZONA ONLINE

After seven years of operation, Arizona Online has solidified itself as a **national leader in online education** by climbing to No. 7 in the U.S. News & World Report's 2022 Best Online Bachelor's Programs rankings. **Undergraduate enrollment has more than doubled** from Fall 2019 to Fall 2022 and has grown 23% year-over-year. Arizona Online offers students more than 160 fully-online programs and certificates. **Arizona Online specializes in serving post-traditional learners** including 85% who work while pursuing their degree, 73% transfer students, 55% identifying as first-generation, 42% who have children to care for, 25% who are Pell eligible, and 21% who are military-connected. Together with partners in Distance and Continuing Education, **Arizona Online transcends the traditional barriers of access, geography and cost** to provide learners an opportunity to earn a prestigious education from Arizona's flagship university – from anywhere.
